# **Our Community**

Hillsdale High School (HHS) is a comprehensive four-year public high school located 20 miles south of San Francisco in the heart of the Peninsula. The student population is approximately 1640. Most families reside in San Mateo or Foster City and represent a wide range of social, educational, ethnic and economic backgrounds. Students and teachers at HHS participate in a multitude of programs both on campus and in the community.

#### **Our School**

Hillsdale offers a rigorous academic program. Over 70% of the school's faculty and staff hold master degrees in their field. In 2016, HHS became one of eight schools from across the nation achieving Gold Recognition as a School of Opportunity by the National Education Policy Center (NEPC). The Schools of Opportunity project celebrates and identifies excellent public high schools that work to close gaps in both opportunity and achievement. Our school's Smaller Learning Community model can significantly restrict the schedules to which students have access. Because our school devotes many class periods to Advisory, there are times when a student does not have access to courses due to a scheduling conflict or is restricted to fewer than 7 periods. This can especially affect AP and elective course selection.

Hillsdale students will need to complete a total of 220 credits in order to receive a diploma. 10 of the 50 required elective credits must be designated as CTE (Career Technical Education). Our local community colleges, College of San Mateo, Cañada College, and Skyline College, partner with Hillsdale to teach courses on San Mateo Union High School District campuses. Courses currently offered are Chamber Singers, Chamber Orchestra, Symphonic Band, Intro to Business, Interpersonal Communication, Intro to Computing Sciences, Career Life Exploration, Gateway to Health Careers, Administration of Justice, Child Development and Psychology.


