Supports for Students in Special Education

Students with IEPs will receive services for Special Education in the General Education classes. By serving in the general education classes, students with IEPs are then supported by both General Education teachers and the Special Education Team.

Establishing a 504 Plan for Incoming Students

If your student currently has a 504 plan, you will need to contact your school counselor and provide a recent 504 plan from the feeder school. Once the school year starts, the counselor will evaluate the 504 Plan and establish a current plan for the new school year. The counselor will gather parent/guardian and teacher feedback plus other data to determine the 504 Plan for a high school setting. Then, the new plan will be shared with the family and all people providing the accommodation. The 504 Plan ensures that a student will have access and prohibits discrimination due to a disability.

The mission of AVID is to ensure that ALL students, and most especially the least served students who are in the middle:


- will succeed in rigorous curriculum

The Purpose of AVID


The purpose of the AVID program is to restructure the teaching methods of an entire school and to open access to the curricula that will ensure four-year college
