| Day of the Exam.....

## ARRIVAL TO EXAM

- ★ Location of all exams: East Gym or specific classroom  
(reminder with specific location will be sent the day before the exam)
  
- ★ Morning Exams:
  - Arrive at location 7:45
  - Exam begins 8:00am
  
- ★ Afternoon Exams
  - Arrive at location 11:45 (eat lunch)
  - Exam begins 12:00pm

## Bring to Exam

- ★ Student ID
- ★ Two sharpened #2 pencils with erasers
- ★ Two pens with black or dark blue ink only
